NAME OUR SNOWPLOWS

In conjunction with our **SNOW PLOW SAFETY CAMPAIGN**, we are partnering with St. Anthony Schools to help name our 4 Plows.

A Touch the Truck Assembly at each elementary school will include safety info, games, and fun, AND their Snow Plow with its new name emblazoned on the hood.

Contest runs Nov. 13 - Nov. 24. Winner to be announced in early December.



Aspen Waste Systems will be the city's new residential waste hauler effective April 1.



In the last couple city newsletters, we shared that the city was working on a waste hauler RFP ahead of the expiration of the current hauler contracts this spring. Through this process, Aspen Waste Systems was selected as the preferred vendor based on several factors including service and pricing. At the Jan. 10 City Council meeting, a new agreement was approved for Aspen to become St. Anthony's organized collection hauler effective April 1. This change will impact all residential properties with up to three units that are currently serviced by Walter's, Republic, or Waste Management.

The last weekly pickup with the current hauler will occur the week of March 27, and Aspen will begin picking up the week of April 3. Following are some important details for the transition:

New Carts

- Three cart sizes will continue to be offered:
 - Small - 35 Gallon (recommended for households of 1-2)
 - Medium - 45 Gallon (recommended for households of 2-3)
 - Large - 95 Gallon (recommended for households of 4+)



Aspen will deliver new garbage and recycling carts to all St. Anthony customers throughout the month of March.

- **Walter's and Republic** customers will default to their current cart sizes with Aspen. No action is needed, but you can visit savm.com/cartsizes or contact Aspen by March 1. If you would like to change cart sizes.

- **Waste Management** customers need to select cart sizes by March 1. Please fill out the form at savm.com/cartsizes or contact Aspen at 612.884.8008 to set up your service. If no selection is made, you will receive medium carts.

Need to make a change after March 1? Please contact Aspen and they will complete within 60 days of the program rollout.

If you don't receive your new carts by March 27, please contact Aspen at 612.884.8008.

Old Carts

Please leave all carts (garbage, recycling, and yard waste) from your current hauler at the curb after your last service the week of March 27. Walter's, Republic, and Waste Management will haul away their carts. Do not use any of your old carts after your last pickup with your current hauler.

Thinking of selling your property?

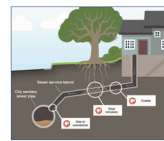
St. Anthony will soon be adopting a new point-of-sale sewer lateral inspection requirement as part of the city's Long-Term Inflow & Infiltration (I/I) Mitigation Program. This means that **two** (2) inspections must be completed prior to the sale of any property.

What is I/I?

Inflow and Infiltration (I/I) is the excess flow of clear water into the City's sanitary sewer system.

- Inflow is when clear water from illegal connections of sump pumps, downspouts, and foundation drains is channeled directly into sanitary sewer pipes.
- Infiltration is when groundwater seeps into sewer pipes from cracks or aging joints.

St. Anthony Village was identified as a contributor of excess I/I and is working with Metropolitan Council Environmental Services to resolve the problem.



What will I need to do?

Prior to the sale of any property, **two** (2) inspections must occur:

- **Inflow Inspection** by a Public Works employee to confirm the property doesn't have a sump pump or drain discharging into the sanitary sewer system. This inspection requirement has been in place for several years and there are no changes to the process. Contact savm@stanthonyvillage.com or call 612.282.2801 to schedule.
- **Tabulated sewer line inspection** by a provider of property owner's choice. The inspection video must include footage from the property to the sewer main and be submitted to the city with an inspection report. This inspection requirement applies to any home advertised for sale after Mar. 1, 2025.

What happens after the video is submitted?

Compliance - For properties that pass inspection, the City issues a Certificate of I/I Compliance which is valid until the time of resale.

Non-Compliance - Properties that don't pass inspection are issued a correction notice detailing the problem such as, but not limited to a crack in the pipe, an offset joint, or tree roots protruding into the pipe. If infiltration exists, repairs must be made to the lateral. For violations discovered at the time of sale, it's the seller's responsibility to correct the violation and submit a post-repair video prior to the sale unless the buyer has assumed responsibility for repairs and has signed a correction agreement with the city.

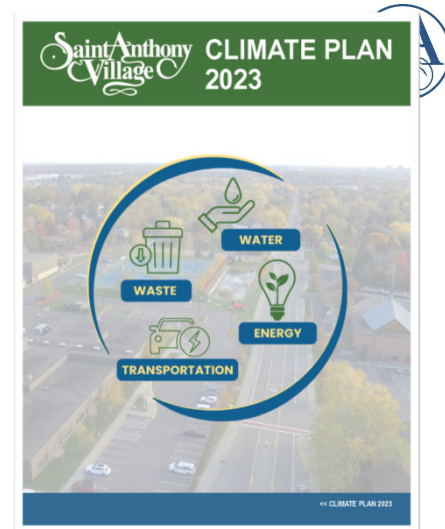

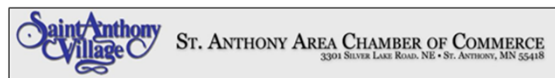
