Resolution: Recognize Indigenous Peoples Day as a City Holiday

### BACKGROUND

At its regular meeting on July 14, 2020 the City Council made changes to the City holiday calendar to discontinue recognizing Good Friday and Columbus Day as City holidays and to recognize Juneteenth as a City holiday. The remaining holiday is provided to staff as a floating paid holiday.

The City Council has wishes to begin recognizing Indigenous Peoples Day as an official City holiday. Beginning in 2022, in place of the floating holiday, staff will be provided a paid holiday on the on the second Monday in October and City Hall will be closed in recognition of Indigenous Peoples Day.

As a result, the 12 observed holidays by the City of Saint Anthony will be:

- New Year's Day – January 1
- Martin Luther King Day Observed – January
- President's Day Observed – February
- Memorial Day Observed – May
- Juneteenth – June
- Independence Day – July 4
- Labor Day Observed – September
- Indigenous Peoples Day – October
- Veteran's Day – November 11
- Thanksgiving Day Observed – November
- Friday following Thanksgiving – November
- Christmas Day – December 25
