

Things people like about St. Anthony:

- Many positive comments about the quality of the school system, especially as compared to nearby Minneapolis SD options
- St. Anthony has a “neighborhood/small town” feel; is small and manageably sized; is safe
- City is walkable, and residents enjoy walking and running in the neighborhood, around the parks, and along the trails. Places called out for being nice:
 - Central Park
 - Silverwood Park
 - St. Anthony Parkway
 - Trails by golf course/cemetery
- Residents enjoy many of the local businesses (the Village Pub, Unofficial, municipal liquor store)

Things people would like to see improved:

- Many shared concerns about pedestrian safety along Kenzie Terrace, specifically in regard to a crosswalk near the gas station.
 - Other concerns include a slow traffic light by the mall and general concerns about the commercial viability of the area
- Many shared concerns about the vacant Walmart site at Silver Lake Village, with lingering frustrations about the abandonment as well as the uncertain future of that area. The word “blight” was used.
- Underutilized gas stations along Stinson (at 33rd and 37th).
- Some dissatisfaction with development in the northeast corner of the city, regarding both residential that doesn’t fit surrounding character as well as some industrial sites
- Damage along Coolidge (potholes)
- More patrols on the south (Minneapolis) side
- One call for more townhouse development; currently, housing options are limited
