

St Anthony May 11th 1858

Town Meeting organized by the election of David Heaton, Chairman, David A. Secombe was duly elected Moderator, and Thomas T. Newel, Clerk.

It was voted to elect overseer of Roads, by ballot.

At Two O'clock, the Moderator made proclamation, that the Polls would close at Four O'clock: at Four o'clock the polls were closed and the votes were counted, and there was found that there was one more vote in the box than the whole number in the Poll Book, which vote was drawn from the box as the law directs.

D.A. Secombe then resigned the office of Moderator, and D.S. B. Johnston was duly elected, and the votes were then canvassed and proclamation made of the result according to law.

"Town Meeting."

The legal voters of the Town of St Anthony, in Hennepin County, in the State of Minnesota, are hereby notified that the Annual Town Meeting for said Town will be held at D. W. Dorman's building, opposite the Post Office in said Town, on Tuesday the 5th day of April Next, being the first Tuesday in said month, for the purposes following: viz:

1st To choose a Moderator to preside at said Meeting.

2nd To elect the Supervisors (one of whom is to be designated as chairman); one Town Clerk; one Assessor; one Collector; one Overseer of the Poor; one Justice of the Peace (to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of A. Grethen); three Overseers of Highways; and as many Pound Masters as the Electors may determine.

3rd To act upon any additional subjects which may in pursuance of law come before the meeting at the proper time, when met.

Said meeting will be called to order between the hours of nine and ten in the forenoon, and be kept open until 4 o'clock P. M. unless sooner closed, in pursuance of the law.

At a Town Meeting held at D. W. Dormans building opposite the Post Office in St Anthony, Hennepin County, Minnesota, within and for said Town of St Anthony, on the 5th day of April 1859, the following proceeding were had.

At Nine and one fourth o'clock A.M. the meeting was called to order by the clerk, and on motion. Wm. Lochren was elected Moderator, and was then and there duly sworn by Solon Armstrong, Justice of the Peace, to support the constitution of the United States, and of the State of Minnesota, and to faithfully and impartially discharge the duties of Moderator at said Town Meeting.

John Martin was then nominated and elected Judge of Election at said meeting, in place of J. B. Gilbert, Supervisor, absent. Charles Miles was then nominated and elected Judge of Election, at said meeting, in place of Richard Fewer, Supervisor, absent.

The said John Martin and Charles Miles were then sworn by Solon Armstrong, Justice of the Peace, duly to support the Constitution of the United States, and of the State of Minnesota, and to faithfully and impartially discharge the duties of Judge of Election at said meeting.

The following Resolution was then proposed and read: "Resolved by the

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Electors of the Town of St Anthony, at the Annual Town Meeting for the year 1859: that the salary of Assessor of this Town be Three Dollars per day for the times necessary for making the Assessment, for the time allowed by law": and on the vote being taken thereon, by yeas and nays, the same was declared passed and adopted.

The following Resolution was then read by the Moderator, "Resolved that there be two Pound Masters elected in this Town, for the year 1859; that there shall be located in this Town two Pounds; one at A. D. Foster's yard in upper Town, and one at D. Edwards yard, in lower Town; when on motion, the said Resolution was laid on the table.
