



GUIDE TO RIGHT-OF-WAY-SIDEWALKS & PUBLIC PROPERTY

HOW TO USE THIS GUIDE:










St. Anthony city codes are designed to prevent offensive or harmful conditions and activities for St. Anthony Village residents and business owners. It is the resident's responsibility to adhere to the code. This document provides the primary requirements and expectations.

City Code Chapter 94 a guide specific to the use, obstruction of or prohibited actions in right-of-way, including sidewalks, public properties and occasional load restrictions.

DESCRIPTION	GENERAL REQUIREMENT
RESTRICTIONS	<ol style="list-style-type: none">Seasonal Load Restrictions<ul style="list-style-type: none">- City may order restricted operation of vehicles, or restricted weight of vehicles, upon any city street that will be seriously damaged or destroyed due to rain, snow, or other climactic conditions- Restriction orders will be posted (M.S. § 169.87), and may be amended.- It is unlawful for any person to operate any vehicle or combination of vehicles on a city street or highway when restrictions are in place.Prohibited Actions or Obstruction on Public Right-of-Ways<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Permit must be issued to obstruct any sidewalk, street, avenue, alley, lane, or other public way in the city with yard clippings, leaves, stone, brick, sand, lumber, or other material or property.- Pushing / blowing snow from driveways and sidewalks onto public roads may be punishable as a misdemeanor- Plowing, shoveling or blowing snow onto any sidewalk, street, avenue, alley, lane, or other public way is prohibited. (MN Statute 160.2715 Sec (a) subdivision (1))- City will notify responsible person to immediately remove any obstruction placed or left on a street or other public way (§ 94.1)5.- If responsible party fails or refuses to remove the obstruction within a reasonable time, it may be removed by the city.- Responsible person will be invoiced to reimburse the city for the cost of removal and payment must be received within 10 days- Owner or occupant of property adjacent to a public sidewalk must keep walkways safe for pedestrians.- Property owner or occupant must remove snow, ice, dirt, or rubbish from walk within 12 hours.
REQUIREMENTS	<ol style="list-style-type: none">Properties Abutting Sidewalks<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Owner of any property within the city abutting a public sidewalk is required to promptly notify city of any needed repairs to keep walk safe for pedestrians.Violations<ul style="list-style-type: none">- City will send written notice to recorded taxpayer's address.- Notice requires conditions to be corrected within 5 days of receipt, or for sidewalk repairs within 30 days.- Failure to comply with the notice within the required period, may result in City correcting conditions at owner's expense and owner will be invoiced.- Unpaid invoices will result in special assessment



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PERMITS Section 94.53	<div><div>1. Obstructions</div><div><div>- Before obstructing a right-of-way, permit must be obtained to allow hinderance free and open passage</div><div>- Permit allows specified equipment to be placed on the right-of-way for the duration specified</div></div><div>2. Trees and Shrubs</div><div><div>- Permit is required to plant any tree or shrub on the public right-of-way</div><div>- The owner of land abutting a public right-of-way is responsible for all care and maintenance of trees and shrubs on the abutting public right-of-way.</div><div>- City may order owner to trim or remove any tree or shrub that is diseased, dangerous, a public nuisance, or planted contrary to this subchapter.</div><div>- Owner failure to comply may result in City order the work done and assess the cost of the work against the abutting land in the same manner as other assessments for municipal improvements.</div><div>- Owner of property abutting right-of-way may apply for permit to replace a tree or shrub removed under § 94.52. City may grant permit when proposed replacement tree or shrub does not interfere with traffic safety, proposed or existing sidewalks and utility easements.</div></div></div>
